Purpose

The purpose of this course is to review the major areas of developmental psychology across the life span. These topics will include biological, cognitive, social, and emotional development.

The specific objectives of the course are to:

1. Identify the different aspects of human psychological development.
2. Discuss major theories of developmental psychology.
3. Apply an understanding of theory to the analysis of research findings.
4. Correlate theory and research findings to real-world experiences of humans at different stages of development.

Course Materials

- **MyDevelopmentLab:** Course content is available in the [Canvas website](#), which will provide links to the MyDevelopmentLab website. You are required to be able to access the MyDevelopmentLab website, which has material to assist you in mastering the material and chapter tests required for the course.

Course Organization

The course is organized in weekly modules (Note: These modules do not always match the chapter numbers). For each chapter there are supplemental assignments designed to elaborate on selected topics within each. They can include:

- Canvas video lectures (with accompanying PowerPoint slides) by the instructor;
- MyDevelopmentLab Chapter tests; and
- MyDevelopmentLab media activities, simulations, and videos.
- Discussion Topics

This material will be covered on the exams.

Course Requirements

1. **Chapter Tests (30% of grade):** There is a chapter test in MyDevelopmentLab for each chapter.

2. **Exams (35% of grade):** There are three exams, proctored online using ProctorU, which consist of multiple choice and short answers:
 - Exam 1 covers Chapters 1, 2, 3, and 5.
 - Exam 2 covers Chapters 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.
 - Exam 3 covers Chapters 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15.
3. **MyDevelopmentLab Media Assignments (5% of grade):** Each chapter has assignments from MyDevelopmentLab consisting of videos and interactive exercises. Additional non-graded material from MyDevelopmentLab can also assist you in learning the material.
 - NOTE: Each chapter in MyDevelopmentLab also has a Chapter Test that is REQUIRED.
4. **Discussion Activities (10% of grade):** There are a series of short discussions activities assigned for selected chapters designed to foster understanding of important concepts. Each discussion topic will require a short written response (less than a page).
5. **Projects (20% of grade):** There are four written projects designed to explore certain topics in more depth and/or designed to enhance your understanding of particular topics. Each Project should be about 2-4 pages (double space in length).
 - **Papers must be submitted to Turnitin.com.** Plagiarism will be reported to the university and will become part of your academic record.

Online Course Evaluation

Students are expected to provide feedback on the quality of instruction in this course by completing online evaluations provided in the course modules (med-term and end-of-term evaluations).

Course Deadline and Extension Policy

Each student is allowed 16 weeks from the time of their enrollment to complete a course. If the time is about to expire, the student will be assigned a failing grade ("E"). Students have the option to request an extension if they have made sufficient academic progress (defined as completing at least 50% of the course) and have extenuating circumstances (i.e., medical, etc.) that have prevented them from completing the course. Each extension petition must be made in writing and will be administratively evaluated by the instructor.

Tuition Refund Policy

A tuition refund will be granted after a Flexible Learning student submits a written request to cancel their course within 30 days of enrollment. Refund requests may be made by fax, email, or U.S. mail. All requests will receive a written response in the form of a detailed receipt. A refund is issued on course materials at the time of cancellation if they are returned within 30 days of sale and are in their original condition. No refunds are granted after 30 days. If a credit card was used to pay for tuition, the refund will be in the form of credit to that card.

Dropping a Course

In order to drop a Flexible Learning course, students must send a written request by email, fax, or mail to the Office of Flexible Learning. After 30 days, no refunds are given and the student will receive a W on their transcript.

Transfers

Students may transfer from one Flexible Learning course to another within 30 days of enrollment. This request must be in writing and sent by fax, email, or U.S. mail. Any difference in tuition will be collected or refunded. There is a \$50.00 transfer fee. After the transfer has taken place, the original enrollment and expiration dates still apply.
